Welcome to FBC Awana

We are honored to participate with you in training your child to serve the Lord. Our Awana program offers several opportunities for your child to grow spiritually through Scripture memorization and a basic understanding of Biblical principles. It also provides an opportunity for children to learn to compete as a team, and to learn to win and lose with a proper attitude of fair play and sportsmanship.

Parental involvement is essential for a child to be successful in Awana. Although leaders will work with your child, it is not possible to learn all verses during the handbook time. The verses are better learned and understood when studied and reviewed at home a few minutes each day. Here are a few suggestions to help your child be as successful as possible:

- **Encourage** your child to be faithful in working through their Awana books. Be sure to explain difficult words or concepts to help make the material meaningful.
- **Inform** your child's leader on how they can better serve your child. You know your child better than we do, and our leaders would appreciate any insight you can share.
- **Validate** the importance of Bible memory by having your child “teach” you the verses.
- **Be patient**, encourage and make learning verses fun!

We hope that this Parent Handbook will be helpful in sharing some information regarding Awana and our Truth & Training (T&T) program.

The History of Awana

The word Awana stands for **Approved Workmen Are Not Ashamed**, and comes from 2 Timothy 2:15

Awana had its beginnings in 1950 as a youth program at the North Side Gospel Center in Chicago, Illinois. Since 1950, Awana has grown from a one-church ministry into one that includes more than 15,000 churches in the United States (all 50 states) and another 1,900 in more than 100 countries worldwide.

Awana at FBC has been serving the church and its community since 1975. Starting in the early 1990's, FBC Awana has felt the need to assist other clubs a world away who could not afford to support the clubs within their own church. Through Awana Clubs International, we have joined the ranks of Adopt-A-Club to support clubs in Jamaica, Ecuador, Uganda, Togo, Russia, Romania, India, Bangladesh, Cuba, and Argentina.

Discipline

Discipline is defined as “training expected to produce a specific character or pattern of behavior, especially training that produces moral or mental improvement (www.thefreedictionary.com).” Discipline is also the process of teaching acceptable behavior and self-control.

Unfortunately, discipline often carries a negative connotation. In an effort to develop good behavior patterns, our first step will be to praise every good effort. Our leaders will make concerted efforts to compliment clubbers for their positive behavior.

Since one of the goals of Awana is to train boys and girls to serve Christ, our Awana leaders will be attentive to correct or redirect behaviors that deviate from God's Word (Bible). We will use a “3” count system to enforce established rules and expectations. If a clubber is intentionally disrespectful or disruptive, we will utilize the following “3” count procedures:

1. A “1” count will be given for the first offense and the leader will provide a verbal explanation regarding the inappropriateness of the behavior.
2. A “2” count will be given for the second offense and the leader or Club Director will provide individual counsel to the clubber.
3. A “3” count will be given for the third offense, with the clubber taken to the Club Commander and the parents contacted. The clubber will be given an opportunity to talk with his/her parents. The Club Commander will also talk with the parents and determine if any further action or meetings are necessary.

It is our sincere prayer that no situation will ever have to be resolved in this manner, and our leaders will make every effort possible to help clubbers avoid disrespectful/disruptive behavior. In an effort to be fair to all other clubbers and leaders, though, the above procedures will be enforced if necessary.

We will also utilize a “5” count system in order to maintain control in a large group setting (Council Time and Game Time). In order to gain the group's attention, a leader will begin counting down from 5 to 1, becoming softer in volume with each number. It is the goal for the group to be totally quiet and ready to listen by the time 1 is reached. In order for the clubber's to understand this “5” count system, it is taught and demonstrated during the first few weeks of Awana.

What We Expect From Our Leaders

Requirements:

- A leader must have a personal relationship with Jesus Christ.
- A leader must be a regular attender at FBC or a Bible-based Christian Church in the Denver area.
- A leader must have a desire to work with and a compassion for children.
- A leader must agree with the Awana Doctrinal Statement as found in the Training Manual.
- A leader must attend the FBC Awana Basic Training.

Expectations:

- We expect our leaders to be on time.
- We expect our leaders to be examples.
- We expect our leaders to follow the rules and wear their uniforms.
- We expect our leaders to display a proper attitude before the clubbers and other leaders.
- We expect our leaders to pray for our Awana Club on a regular basis.
- We expect our leaders to realize that FBC Awana is not just a program, but a ministry of the church and a place of service to God.

What We Expect From Parents

- Always encourage your child. Children have much more fun when Mom and Dad show interest in their accomplishments.
- Help your child to attend Awana every week and to arrive on time. Consistency builds friendships, achievement, and self-discipline.
- During the week, help your child to prepare two to three sections. This will ensure that they will complete their handbook and receive their special awards. Identify the sections your child will be reciting through the use of a sticky-note, paperclips, or short note.
- Attend all major events. Parents are always welcome every night, and are also encouraged to attend special events as a way of showing support and approval.
- Please review the Clubber Expectations (found later in this handbook) with your child.
- Please plan to pick up clubbers promptly at 8:00 pm in their designated locations. Clubbers will not be allowed to leave their designated area without an adult or older sibling picking them up.
- If your child needs to be excused from participating in Game Time, please send a note to that effect to their leader.

What We Expect From Clubbers

- Always be prepared. Each week you will need to memorize and recite two to three sections to complete your handbook by the end of the year.
- Always be respectful of those around you (adults and fellow clubbers). Watch your surroundings and see where you can help others.
- Wear your uniform and bring your Bible, and handbook each Club night. Have these items ready during check-in to earn individual Awana bucks.
- Participate in your Club each week during game time, handbook time, and council time.
- Every child must sign in at the registration desk each week.
- No food, drink, or running in the church is allowed.

Awana Nightly Club Schedule

Each Awana Club meeting is divided into three sessions:

Council Time: During this session, the Clubbers hear a lesson from God's Word. This "heart of the Awana Club" will often close with awards and announcements.

Game Time: This session features unique and exciting games around the Awana game circle. Clubbers compete in both individual and team games.

Handbook Time: During this time, Clubbers recite verses/sections in their book to a leader/listener. Emphasis is placed on helping Clubbers achieve their goals in Bible memory and helping them to understand what the verses mean.

T&T Handbooks

T&T is different from other Awana programs. It is comprised of two clubs with distinct curriculum, uniforms, and awards: T&T Ultimate Adventure for 3rd-4th grades, and T&T Ultimate Challenge for 5th-6th grades.

T&T Ultimate Adventure teaches 3rd and 4th graders that salvation in Christ is the ultimate adventure! Kids in T&T learn that the Bible is true and they can firmly trust what it says. Each Ultimate Adventure handbook answers four questions about God and the Bible that 3rd and 4th graders frequently ask. Clubbers learn eight answers to each of these questions along with verses to back up these answers. The handbooks include Bible studies and activities that allow children to go deeper into the subject matter. Before working in a handbook, kids new to T&T complete a short booklet that explains God's plan of salvation.

T&T Ultimate Challenge trains fifth- and sixth-graders that walking faithfully with Christ is the ultimate challenge! Each Ultimate Challenge handbook answers four questions about God and the Bible that preteens typically ask. Kids learn eight answers to each of these questions, memorizing verses that back up the answers. Bible studies, activities and service opportunities take them further into the subject matter. Before working in a handbook, kids new to T&T complete a short booklet that explains God's plan of salvation.

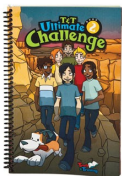

Each Handbook consists of eight Discoveries/Challenges with seven sections in each (56 sections in each book). All sections **must** be recited in **sequential order**, with two exceptions: Bringing a friend to club, and the missionary interview. To complete a section, all Bible verses and activities must be said/completed at one time. The Clubber is allowed 2 "helps" (a verbal or non-verbal prompt) from a leader/listener per section. References (Bible verses) are required to be known and recited. Each Clubber may work at his/her own pace, but in order to finish a Handbook during the year, the Clubber should average approximately two Sections per week. When a child is sick and misses Awana, or during breaks (ie, Christmas break), sections may be said/completed to their parents. When a Handbook is finished prior to the end of the year, the Clubber may complete the Silver & Gold Extra Credit sections.

T&T Listener Guidelines

- Clubbers are allowed two “helps” (a verbal or non-verbal prompt) from a listener per section (not per verse, if the section contains multiple verses).
- References (Bible verses) are required to be known and recited.
- No “helps” are allowed during the **review** of a handbook.
- Check to make sure the listener card reflects the appropriate handbook.
- There is no limit on the number of sections that can be recited each week, but Clubbers should strive for reciting 2 sections per week if their goal is to finish the Handbook by year end.
- With the “new” handbooks, sections **must** be recited in **sequential order**, with the following exceptions: Bring a Friend, Missionary Interview
- Before initiating listening, please review the child's listener card to ensure that it is complete and accurately reflects the section(s), indicated by the Clubber, to be recited.
- Clubbers are allowed to recite sections to their parents when they are either sick and miss Awana, or during breaks from Awana (ie, Christmas break). Upon returning from breaks (Thanksgiving, Christmas, Spring), check the listener card and ask the Clubber if their parents signed off on any recited sections during the break. Update the listener card if necessary, using either the actual date of recitation (if known), or the current date.
- It is vital that recited sections be recorded accurately and completely, and that an accurate recitation date be reflected on the listener card to ensure that the Clubber's receive the awards they have earned, so please re-check the listener card prior to returning to the Clubber.

Awana Grand Prix: Clubbers, Start Your Engines !

The Awana Grand Prix is a Pinewood Derby-style outreach event founded in 1964 to draw fathers to club to hear the gospel message. Approximately 200,000 boys and girls compete annually in more than 5,000 Grand Prix events nationwide. The Awana Grand Prix is a family-oriented affair that allows clubbers to express their ingenuity by creating and racing their own wooden Grand Prix cars while enabling clubs to share God's plan of salvation with clubbers' unsaved family members by attracting them to a fun event involving their child. Grand Prix events usually last about two hours or the equivalent of one club meeting.

Clubbers earn their Grand Prix car kits by completing twelve (12) sections in their handbook. Clubbers then construct their cars, usually with the help of a parent or leader. A Grand Prix Construction Workshop will also be held prior to the Grand Prix to offer help for beginners and those not mechanically gifted. The cars race on a wooden four-lane track. Awards are given for both design and speed. Clubs award first-, second- and third-place trophies for each category. Each clubber who participates also receives a ribbon.

The Grand Prix provides a challenging, stimulating change in the club year that can draw children back after holidays or a drop in attendance. Children's parents also get involved and the gospel is presented after check-in but prior to races so unsaved family members hear God's plan of salvation clearly presented. The Awana Grand Prix is not only a fun activity but a powerful tool for reaching unsaved parents.

Wellness Policy

- Bad cough – coughing increases the chance of infection being spread to others.
- Any rash that is suspected to be contagious
- If your child is prescribed an antibiotic, they must have been on the antibiotic for a minimum of 48 hours prior to attending Awana.
- Any highly contagious illness such as pink eye.
- Was unable to attend school that day due to illness.

Adverse Weather

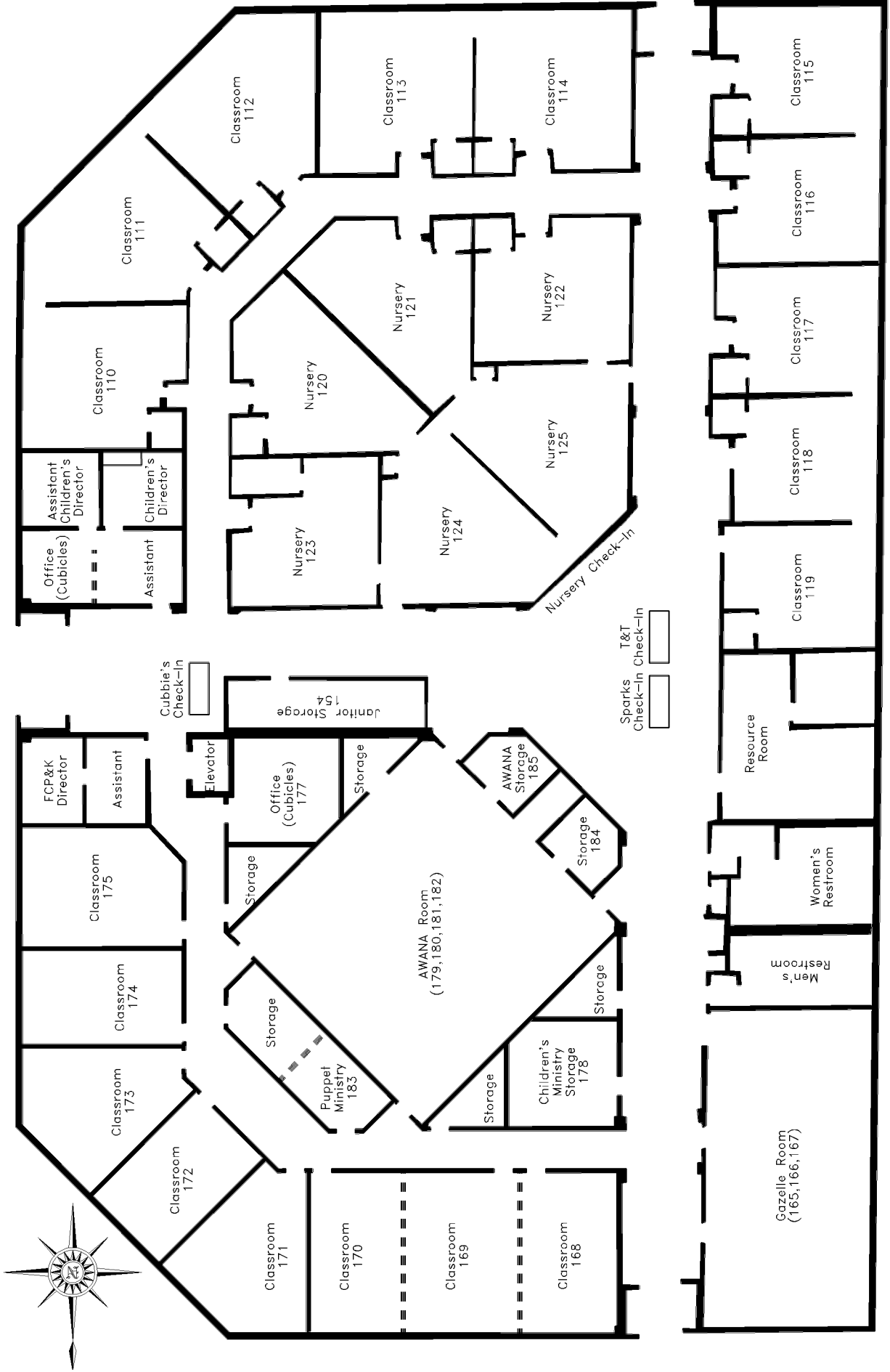
