Big Idea: In His wisdom and sovereignty, God calls His people to do things that don't make sense to us.

Prepare: Listen to the sermon (if you haven't already), read Jonah 1, and spend a few minutes praying for your group.

Connect:

The Broncos made the playoffs! What's your favorite Broncos memory from your lifetime?

Discuss:**HEAD: WHAT DOES THE BIBLE SAY?**

1. What stood out to you about this week's sermon?

2. Read Jonah 1 aloud as a group.
 - a. Many people who have a difficult time with the Bible doubt the historical truth of Jonah. How might you be able to talk to someone with this viewpoint?

 - b. When it comes to the spread and sharing of God's word, what similarities are there between Jonah and the Disciples? What about the Church today?

HEART: HOW DOES THIS CHANGE MY ATTITUDES AND AFFECTIONS?

1. How does God's pursuit of the city of Nineveh challenge our understanding of grace and justice?

- a. Who (person or people group) does this change the way you approach?

2. What does Jonah's initial reaction to God's call reveal about the human heart when confronted with a difficult calling?
 - a. Has there been (or is there) a situation in your life that allows you to relate to Jonah's response to God?

3. Jonah's story starts with him running but ends with God's relentless pursuit. How has God pursued you in your own life, especially when you've tried to run away?

HANDS: WHAT IS THIS PASSAGE ASKING US TO DO?

1. God gives a call to every believer, sometimes a lifetime calling and/or sometimes for a season. Where do you sense the Lord calling you to action? How can you take a step of obedience this week?

2. Ask God to allow you to see your daily routine from His divine perspective (colleagues at work, circle of friends, and acquaintances you routinely breeze past). Who do you notice, or who have you overlooked or counted out that God is inviting you to notice? Write down 1-3 names and be praying for the Gospel to transform their hearts.
