These questions are designed to guide you in your weekly Growth Group gathering. Discuss them with people in your life to help you deepen your faith and grow in community. Not in a Growth Group? Check out our open groups at foothillsbiblechurch.org/growth-groups.



Big Idea: Everyone has a story.

Prepare: Listen to the sermon (if you haven't already), read Galatians 1, and spend a few minutes praying for your group.

Connect: What accomplishment are you most proud of in your life?

Discuss:

HEAD: WHAT DOES THE BIBLE SAY?

1. What stood out to you about this week's sermon?

2. Read Galatians 1:15 and Ephesians 1:3-8 aloud as a group. How does the truth that the Gospel found you, not the other way around, bring freedom and confidence to live out our faith each day?

3. Read Galatians 1:16-17 and Psalm 46:10 aloud as a group. What periods of quiet or prolonged formation have helped you know Jesus more deeply?

HEART: HOW DOES THIS CHANGE MY ATTITUDES AND AFFECTIONS?

1. Read Galatians 1:10-14 aloud as a group. Paul talks about both his successes and sin without defensiveness. Where are you tempted to protect your past rather than allowing grace to reinterpret it?

2. How has your personal encounter with Jesus reoriented your life?

3. Paul was initially characterized by extreme zeal, rather than by his Gospel-centeredness. Are there areas of your faith that you are passionate about but are not necessarily Gospel-centered?

HANDS: WHAT IS THIS PASSAGE ASKING US TO DO?

1. How would you share what Jesus has done in your life with someone in 90 seconds?

2. Your story is a powerful tool, as you are evidence of Gospel transformation! Who in your life needs to hear your story? Pray Ephesians 6:19-20, and with boldness and joy share with that person this week!
